Submitted as part of healthy reflection on ministry practice and as per Regulation 2.2.1.c

Preaching of the Word

- Preaching in each of the three services at St. Matthews Uniting Church as per the preaching roster. This usually takes the form of me being the predominant preacher in the two morning services, and a shared load in the evening.
- Leading special services for Easter and Christmas as part of the Special Religious Education (SRE) program at the local school
- Newsletter contributions each week which have a sermonic element which complement or augment the Sunday sermon

Presiding at the Celebration of the Sacraments

- Monthly presiding over the Eucharist as per the tradition of the congregation
- Presiding over 3 baptisms as per the request of families who have approached the Church

Providing for Other People to Preside in Worship and Preach and Participate in the Leadership of Sunday Services

- Helping organise a roster for liturgists who lead the service up until the Bible Reading and sermon/ message
- Supporting the tradition of the St. Matthew's Congregation for leading in the service through Bible readings and prayers
- Encouraging other members of the congregation to preach and ensuring that there is space in the preaching plan for this.
- Inviting people to share in the leadership of Communion, on top of the participation of Elders in serving the element.
- Inviting guests to come and lead services and preach, including a pulpit sharing in our local ministry zone.

DUTIES OF A MINISTER

- **2.2.1.a** Within the ministry of the whole Church, Jesus Christ calls men and women to proclamation of the gospel in word and deed through the ministry of the Word and the ministry of Deacon. This calling is exercised by:
- (i) preaching of the Word;
- (ii) presiding at the celebration of the sacraments;
- (iii) providing for other persons to preside at worship and/or preach within the pastoral charge in which the Minister is in placement;
- (iv) witnessing in the community to the gospel of Jesus Christ;
- (v) guiding and instructing the members of the Church and equipping them for their ministry in the community;
- (vi) nurturing candidates for baptism and confirmation;
- (vii) pastoral oversight and counsel wherever needed;
- (viii) serving in the community, especially among those who are hurt, disadvantaged, oppressed or marginalized;
- (ix) careful attention to administrative responsibilities;
- (x) due observance of the discipline of the Church;
- (xi) the enhancement of the Minister's own gifts for the work of ministry;
- (xii) pioneering new expressions of the gospel and encouraging effective ways of fulfilling the mission of the Church.
- **b.** Every Minister shall participate fully and regularly in the public worship of God and the mission and fellowship of the Congregation with which the Minister is enrolled (See Reg. 2.9.3).
- **c.** Every Minister shall report annually to the Presbytery with which the Minister is enrolled on the ways in which the duties of a Minister as prescribed in Regulations 2.2.1.a and 2.2.1.b are being exercised.

- Lead, preach and preside over sacraments in weekly Church services. With a shared leadership roster with a 'liturgist' who leads the first half of the service, my role in each service varies. I am a person in roster and will lead when no-one else is available.
- Presentation of 'Learning Together' segment in each service. Previously, this was shared with Youth and Young People's Worker, but since their departure, this has been mostly led by myself. However, we are recruiting more people for this role.
- As a guitarist and singer, I assist in the leading of music in both 9.30am and 6.45am services.




