Looking Back Looking Forward

November 22 marks fifty years since the opening of our current centre. In that time we have seen much change and much stay the same. We have seen changes to the building, to programs offered, levels of attendance, members of the congregation come and go. We have experienced a range of leadership and ministry from people lay and ordained. We have been blessed to have many former ministry leaders come back during this month of celebration and lead us in thinking and reflection. A common theme has been looking forward and how we will continue to hear God's ministry as we seek to live out our life and witness, faithfully growing together as a community of faith.

We have had much that has stayed the same. We have faithful members of the congregation who have been a part of our community from before and continuing onto this site. We have faithfully gathered each

Sunday to connect with God and be encouraged together towards love and good works. We have continued to seek to faithfully serve the community of the hills in ways that we feel called to and are able. Some of these ways have changed, the names of things might have evolved, different leaders have come and gone, but all of this being a part of faithful discipleship has been a constant element of our life and witness.

As we look forward to what might be our life and witness for the next fifty years and beyond, it is good to look back and remind ourselves of some foundational understandings. The Basis of Union is the statement which set the groundwork for coming into the Uniting Church. We will celebrate being the Uniting Church in two years' time. This statement is helpful even today as we seek to build upon fifty years of life and witness in the Hills area. https://uniting.church/basisofunion/

As the Uniting Church, we believe, "that Christians in Australia are called to bear witness to a unity of faith and life in Christ which transcends cultural and economic, national and racial boundaries." We believe. "That the Church is able to live and endure through the changes of history only because its Lord comes, addresses, and deals with people in and through the news of his completed work. Christ who is present when he is preached among people is the Word of God who acquits the guilty, who gives life to the dead and who brings into being what otherwise could not exist. Through human witness in word and action, and in the power of the Holy Spirit, Christ reaches out to command people's attention and awaken faith; he calls people into the fellowship of his sufferings, to be the disciples of a crucified Lord; in his own strange way Christ constitutes, rules and renews them as his Church."

We look to the future affirming that we are part of, "the people of God on the way to the promised end. The Uniting Church prays that, through the gift of the Spirit, God will constantly correct that which is erroneous in its life, will bring it into deeper unity with other Churches, and will use its worship, witness and service to God's eternal glory through Jesus Christ the Lord."

As we seek to be the Church today, celebrating fifty years of ministry to our local community and beyond, let us remember that we are the Church. It is not the building or an institution. It is us, the living disciples of Jesus who form the Body of Christ. We are the Body of Christ and each one of us is a part of it [1 Corinthians 12:27] We each have ministry to do. We are all ministers as Dirk van Doorene reminded us in his sermon in the 8am service, and we even used to have that on the top of our newsletter. "The Uniting Church affirms that every member of the Church is engaged to confess the faith of Christ crucified and to be his faithful servant. It acknowledges with thanksgiving that the one Spirit has endowed the members of Christ's Church with a diversity of gifts, and that there is no gift without its corresponding service: all ministries have a part in the ministry of Christ."

As we seek to continue to faithfully grow together as St. Matthew's Uniting Church Baulkham Hills let us remember that we are the Church. Christ calls us into faith and ministry as we seek to bear his love, the love of God, to our local community and beyond. "Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how we may

spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another." [Hebrews 10:23-25]

What God is calling us to next, having looked back and celebrated fifty years of life and witness, is something to look forward to and really do some good thinking about.




Morning Tea Help Required

How doing little things makes a big difference.

Topic: Modern Slavery

The latest Media Release from the Office of the NSW Anti-slavery Commissioner states that reports of modern slavery to the 1800 FREEDOM hotline run by the NSW Anti-slavery Commissioner have surged 116% in the past financial year. Around half of these calls come from temporary migrant workers.

The NSW Anti-slavery Commissioner, Dr James Cockayne stated that "People are being deceptively recruited, trapped in debt bondage, pushed into forced labour and trafficked, many of them by dodgy labour hire companies that operate much more easily in NSW than neighbouring states, because there is no licensing requirement here." He has called for urgent, whole-of-government action in NSW to tackle modern slavery. A priority is closing a legal loophole that allows unlicensed labour hire firms to operate freely in NSW, unlike in Victoria and Queensland, where licensing schemes are already in place. This makes NSW a target for dodgy labour hire operators.

The 2025 U.S. Trafficking in Persons Report, recently published by the US State Department, backs the call, highlighting persistent risks for migrant workers in Australia and urging stronger labour hire regulation.

The most recent report from the Office of the NSW Anti-Slavery Commissioner mentions gaps that must urgently be addressed by the NSW Government, including:

The absence of labour hire regulation

That not a single dollar is formally earmarked in the state budget for anti-slavery efforts, though more than 450 public agencies and councils have anti-slavery obligations

The failure by the Department of Communities and Justice to meet a statutory expectation for the development of a system of support for victims of forced under-age marriage, one year after being notified to do so by the Commissioner

The absence of any formal Direction relating to procurement activities.
